National Seminar on "Environmental Re-engineering: Series 8-The Year of Sustainable Tourism" on 9th Dec. 2017. The two days National Level Seminar on 'Environmental Reengineering Series 8, Year of Sustainable Tourism', organized by MES' Pillai College of Education and Research, New Panvel, on 9th December 2017, began its registration at 9:00 a.m.

The seminar began with the inaugural session coordinated by our Organizing Secretary Mrs. Bindu Tambe. The session also had the august presence of Mr. A. L.
