1. International Yoga Day:



This visit was a perfect opportunity to understand the need of specially abled children and the teaching techniques required for their physical and mental well-being.





b. Case study on NGOs working for Children With Special Needs (CWSN)

As part of the B.Ed. curriculum, student teachers are often required to conduct research and gather information on various NGOs (Non-Governmental Organizations) working for children with special needs. NGOs working for CWSN are organizations dedicated to providing support, education, and resources for children with various disabilities such as physical, mental, and developmental disabilities. These organizations work towards empowering CWSN by providing them with equal opportunities, resources, and a supportive environment that allows them to live with dignity and lead fulfilling lives. Researching and gathering information on such NGOs can be a valuable learning experience for student teachers. By learning about the efforts and achievements of these organizations, student teachers can expand their knowledge and understanding of the challenges faced by these children, as well as the different types of disabilities that exist. It also helps them develop a greater sense of empathy and sensitivity towards CWSN which can serve as an asset in their future teaching career.




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c. Catering to the needs of children with special needs

Inclusive education refers to the idea that all students, regardless of their abilities or disabilities, should have equal access to education. However, this goal cannot be achieved without a deep understanding of the types of disability found in children and the various assistive technologies available to help them deal with their disabilities. As part of their training, student teachers were tasked with exploring various information and communication technology tools that cater to the needs of children with special needs. This assignment helps student teachers to understand which tool is best suited for a particular disability, enabling them to create more inclusive learning environments that cater to the diverse needs of all students.





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4. Sustainable Development Goals:

a. Paper-bag making and distribution: Pillai College of Education Research, New Panyel

Paper bag making is an annual yearlong environmental initiative by PCER. We prepare paper bags out of old magazines or old newspapers. These bags are then stamped with environment friendly message and distributed to few vendors in the Khanda Colony market area.

b. Educational visit:

On 14th September 2022, an educational visit was organized to **Muenzer Bharat Private Limited**, an organization which collects Used Cooking Oil (UCO) and processes it into sustainable biofuel. The main objective of this visit was to make the student teachers aware of the ill-effects of consuming re-used cooking oil and how leftover Used Cooking Oil can be effectively processed into Biofuels. Replacing fossil fuels with biofuels has the potential to reduce some undesirable aspects of fossil fuel production and use, including conventional and greenhouse gas (GHG) pollutant emissions, exhaustible resource depletion, and dependence on unstable foreign suppliers.

c. E-waste collection Drive

Plastic waste is an issue which is still prevalent on our planet however due to increase in technology, the next hurdle faced by humankind is increasing e-waste. Proper disposal of e-waste is a burning concern therefore the Nature club decided to collaborate with Thane Mahanagar Palika's Swacch Sarvekshan 2022 for creating awareness among the student teachers about e-waste and its proper disposal. Student teachers collected e-waste from their family and relatives and submitted it to the college. The college in turn donated e-waste to the organization for its eco-friendly method of disposal.



d. Managing Plastic Waste - Making Ecobricks:

Plastic is an amazing material with incredible properties, however when it goes to 'waste', it contaminates the ecosystems that sustain us and our fellow species.



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Ecobricks enable plastic to be secured out of industry and the biosphere. To make good use of plastic waste, PCERP students made eco bricks & packed all non-recyclable waste into a single-use plastic/ PET bottle. The collected bottles will then be used in making furniture.






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b. Catering to the needs of children with special needs
